



STORAGE OF PRIVATE EQUIPMENT POLICY

Effective December 2023

General

- Private boat storage is a privilege granted by the Committee and is not an automatic right by members of the Club
- The committee, head coach &/or boat captain will be responsible for implementation of this policy
- Should a member not use their boat for a period of 3 months without satisfactory explanation of the circumstances then the Committee may remove the equipment to higher storage or request removal from the shed.
- Storage is for boats, oars and riggers, herein referred to as equipment
- Details and a description of equipment is to be provided to the club & updated if required.
- All equipment must be labelled and marked accordingly.
- The boat allocation is not transferable
- Any breach of this policy will be considered and dealt with by the committee accordingly.

Storage Fee & payment

- The storage fee is per seat per calendar year.
- Fees are due within 14 days of invoicing
- Failure to pay within the allotted time could result in cancellation of the existing shelving allocation. The applicant will be requested to remove their equipment and be placed on the waiting list until another space is available.
- Equipment not removed within 30 days of notification will be considered uncollected goods and will be removed from the shed to an outside rack at the owner risk.
- Equipment that has been left on the GUSPRC premises (including outsideracks) for a period of twelve (12) months will be considered abandoned and will be disposed of at the committees discretion.



Insurance and Duty of Care

- Neither the club or the committee take any responsibility for damage or otherwise to private equipment stored on their premises (including outside racks) whilst in the shed or on the water.
- Neither the club or the committee take any responsibility for any accidental damage or damage as a result of an accident or otherwise to private equipment whilst being transported on club trailers or by other clubs.
- Insurance for privately owned equipment is the responsibility of the owner including any excess.

Safety

- GUSPRC recommend that single scullers do not row alone.
- River and club rules must be adhered to between sunset and sunrise.
- Lights are mandatory as per QLD Maritime rules.
- All rowers are required to sign in and out for each session. A diary is provided at the front desk and must be completed.

Regattas

- Club boats are given priority for transportation to regattas.
- Owners of private boats should advise their coach or the club captain if transportation is required.
- Private owners are required to assist with the rigging, derigging, loading and unloading of club boats for regattas.

Acceptance

Payment of storage fees will be considered acceptance of this policy. Non-acceptance and failure to pay will result in removal as per "Storage fee & payment" section above
